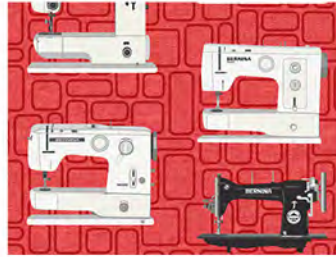
# BERNINA Serger Quilt Fabric

For the blocks,  
you need 3/4 yard of:



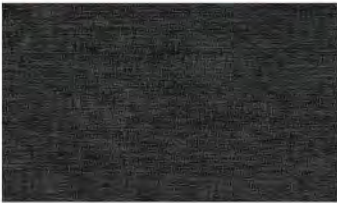
BERNINA Vintage Teal  
2279-84

For the borders,  
you need 2 strips (3-1/2" x WOF) of:



BERNINA Vintage Red  
2279-10

For the background,  
you need 4 strips (3-1/2" x WOF) of:



Charcoal 9636-12

For the binding,  
you need 1/2 yard of:



Rose 9636-26

For the stripes, you need 3 strips (2-1/2" x WOF) of EACH of the following:



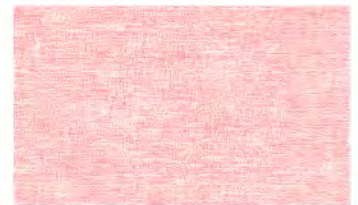
Rose 9636-26



Spa 9636-57



Steel 9636-13



Coral 9636-02

## BERNINA Serger Quilt Instructions

The BERNINA Serger Quilt is a 40-1/2" x 54-1/2" modern quilt designed by Amanda Murphy to celebrate the introduction of the amazing BERNINA Serger!. It showcases her BERNINA Vintage fabric and Cotton Shot coordinates for Contempo of Benartex. In addition to the yardage for the version of your choice listed on the preceding pages you will need:

- Batting
- Serging and quilting thread
- 1-3/8 yards Cotton Shot wideback in Charcoal (9636W-12) or Platinum (9636W-14) for backing

### Cutting

#### Blocks:

Cut 2 strips 12-1/2" x WOF. Subcut into 8 rectangles 8-1/2" x 12-1/2".

#### Background and Border Strips:

Trim these strips to 40-1/2" long.

#### Binding:

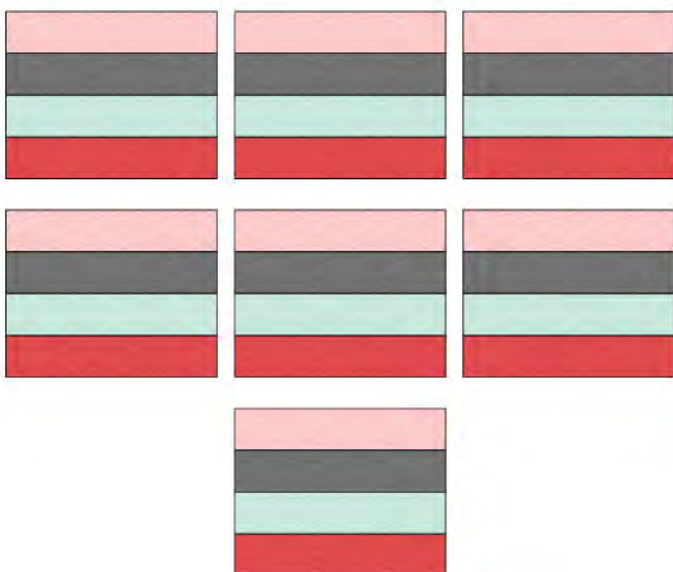
Cut 5 strips 2-1/4" x WOF.

### Piecing

*"WOF" refers to width of fabric. All seams are 1/4". Press all seams open, unless otherwise noted.*

#### Stripes

Join one of each color of the 2-1/2" strips to form a strip set as shown. Repeat to make a second and third strip set. Cut the strip sets into 7 segments 12-1/2" wide.



### Assembly

Following the Assembly Diagram below, join the strip set segments to the blocks to form the rows.

Arrange the rows with the Background rectangles 3-1/2" x 40-1/2". Join the rows.

Join a Border rectangle 3-1/2" x 40-1/2" to the top and bottom of the quilt.

### Finishing

Quilt as desired.

Join the 2-1/4" wide binding strips into 1 continuous piece for binding. Press, folding in half lengthwise. Join the binding to quilt on the front, hand stitching to the back to secure.
