## Basics Instructions

Read through the instructions before beginning
All seams are sewn with $1 / 4$ " seam allowance unless noted
RST means right sides together
Visit jessicadayon.blogspot.com and go to the Pattern Corrections tab to see if there have been any corrections made to this pattern.

## Finished Quilt Size: 50 1/2" x 60 1/2"

## Materials

Yardage is based on 42" -wide fabric
1 pack of 5" squares (also called Charm squares), 30 squares needed total
7/8 yard Alpine print fabric
3/8 yard Solid Pink fabric
1 7/8 yards Solid White fabric
$1 / 2$ yard of binding fabric
3 3/4 yards of backing fabric
$57 " \times 67 "$ piece of batting

## Cutting

## From 30-5" squares, cut:

4-2 1/2" x $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from each 5 " square, for a total of 120 squares ( 30 groups of 4)

## From the alpine print fabric, cut:

4 strips, $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$, crosscut into 60 pieces, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## From the solid pink fabric, cut:

4 strips, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$, crosscut into 60 squares, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## From the solid white fabric, cut:

4 strips, $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$, crosscut into 60 pieces, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
14 strips, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x $42^{\prime \prime}$, crosscut into 210 squares, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## From the binding fabric, cut:

6 strips, $21 / 2 " \times 42 "$

## Making the Blocks

Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press all seam allowances in the direction indicated by the arrows.

1. Using one group of 4-2 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares cut from the 5 " squares and $5-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of solid white, sew a nine patch as shown below. Press. The nine patch should measure $61 / 2 "$ x $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, including the seam allowance. Repeat these steps to make a total of 30 nine patch units.


Make 30 nine patch units, each measuring 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"
2. Using one nine patch made in step $1,4-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of solid white, and 4-2 $1 / 2$ " x $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ piece of alpine print, make block A as shown below. Block A should measure $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10$ $1 / 2$ ", including the seam allowance. Repeat these steps to make a total of 15 block A's.


Make 15 block A's, each measuring 10 1/2" x 10 1/2"
3. Using one nine patch made in step 1, 4- $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of solid pink, and 4-2 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ piece of solid white, make block B as shown below. Block B should measure $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10$ $1 / 2$ ", including the seam allowance. Repeat these steps to make a total of 15 block B's.


Make 15 block B's, each measuring 10 1/2" x 10 1/2"

## Assembling the Quilt Top

1. Join three Block A and 2 Block B together, as shown below, to make an A row. Press. The A row should measure $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, including the seam allowances. Repeat to make a total of three block rows.


Make 3 A rows, measuring 10 1/2" x 50 1/2"
2. Join three Block B and 2 Block A together, as shown below, to make a B row. Press. The B row should measure $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2 "$, including the seam allowances. Repeat to make a total of three block rows.


Make 3 B rows, measuring 10 1/2" x 50 1/2"
3. Join the A and B block rows together, as shown in the quilt assembly diagram below. The quilt top should measure $501 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, including the seam allowances.

## Finishing the Quilt

1. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste the layers together.
2. Hand or machine quilt as desired.
3. Using the 6-2 $1 / 2$ " strips of binding fabric, make the binding and attach it to the quilt.
