

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Basics Instructions



Read through the instructions before beginning All seams are sewn with 1/4" seam allowance unless noted RST means right sides together

Finished Quilt Size

Throw: 63 1/2" x 63 1/2"

Materials

Yardage is based on 42" -wide fabric.

13 assorted blue fat eighths
Scraps for red, green, and brown
3 yards white fabric
5/8 yard fabric for binding
4 yards of fabric for backing
70" x 70" piece of batting

Cutting

From EACH of the blue fat eighths, cut:

2- 3 1/2" x 21" strips, crosscut into 10 squares, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" (125 squares total)

From the red fabric, cut:

1-6" x 6 1/2" piece

From the green fabric, cut:

1-21/2" x 21/4" piece

From the brown fabric, cut:

1-11/4" x 21/4" piece

From the white fabric, cut:

10-3 1/2" x 42" strips, crosscut into 100 squares, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
6-9 1/2" x 42" strips, crosscut into 23 squares, 9 1/2" x 9 1/2"
1-2" x 42" strip, crosscut into 2-2" x 9 1/2" pieces, 2-2" squares, 1-1 1/2" x 6 1/2" piece,
1-1 1/4" x 5 1/2" piece, 1-1 1/2" x 3" piece, and 1-1 1/2" square
1-2 1/2" x 42" strip, crosscut into 2-2 1/2" squares, 1-2 1/4" x 2 3/4" piece, 1-1 1/4" square, and
1-1" square

From the binding fabric, cut:


7 strips, 2 1/2" x 42"



Making the Blocks


Use a 1/4" seam allowance.

1. Using 5- 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares of blue and 4- 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares of white, make a nine patch block as shown below. The nine patch block should measure 9 1/2" x 9 1/2", including the seam allowances. Repeat these steps to make a total of 25 nine patch blocks..



Make 25 nine patch block, 9 1/2" x 9 1/2"

2. Gather the pieces listed in the image below. Use the stitch and slip corner method and the pieces listed below to make the leaf, stem, and apple. Sew the white pieces to the stem. Then sew the stem and bottom white strip to the apple. Finally, sew the white strips onto the sides of the apple. The apple block should measure $9 \frac{1}{2}$ x $9 \frac{1}{2}$, including the seam allowances.



Make 1 apple block, $9\ 1/2"\ x\ 9\ 1/2"$



Assembling the Quilt Top




1. Arrange 4- nine patch blocks and 3- 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" white squares as shown below to make an A row. The A row should measure 9 1/2" x 63 1/2", including the seam allowances. Repeat to make a total of four A rows.




Make 4 A rows, measuring 9 1/2" x 63 1/2"

2. Arrange 4- 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" white squares and 3- nine patch blocks as shown below to make a B row. The B row should measure 9 1/2" x 63 1/2", including the seam allowances. Repeat to make a total of two B rows.




Make 2 B rows, measuring 9 1/2" x 63 1/2"

3. Arrange 3- 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" background squares, 1 apple block, and 3- nine patch blocks as shown below to make a C row. The C row should measure 9 1/2" x 63 1/2", including the seam allowances.



Make 1 C row, measuring 9 1/2" x 63 1/2"

4. Join the rows together as shown in the quilt assembly diagram below. The quilt top should measure $63 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $63 \frac{1}{2}$ ", including the seam allowances.

Finishing the Quilt

- 1. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste the layers together.
- 2. Hand or machine quilt as desired.
- 3. Using the strips cut from the binding fabric, make the binding and attach it to the quilt.
